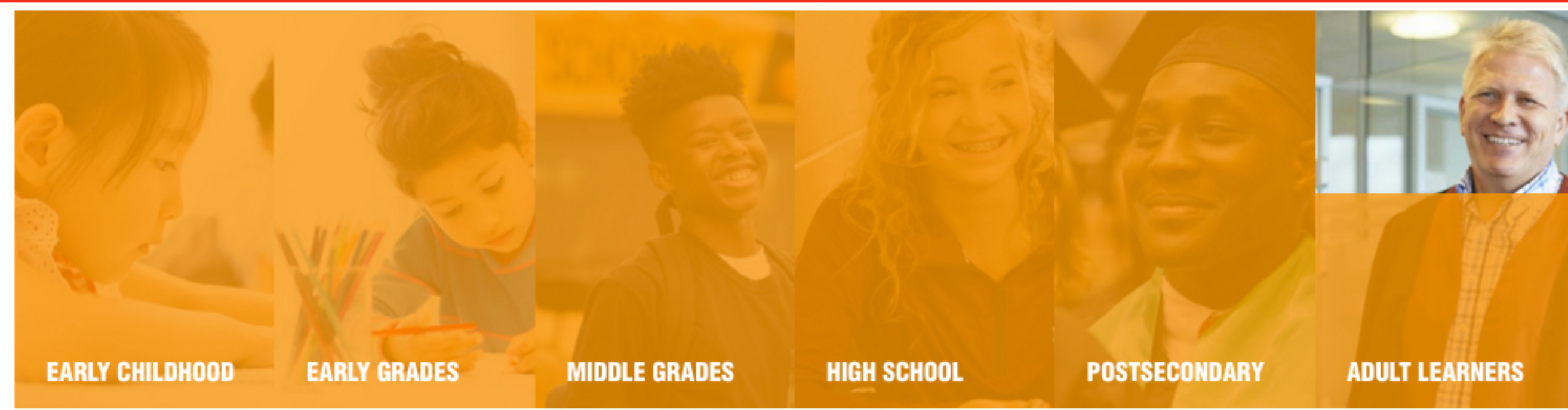

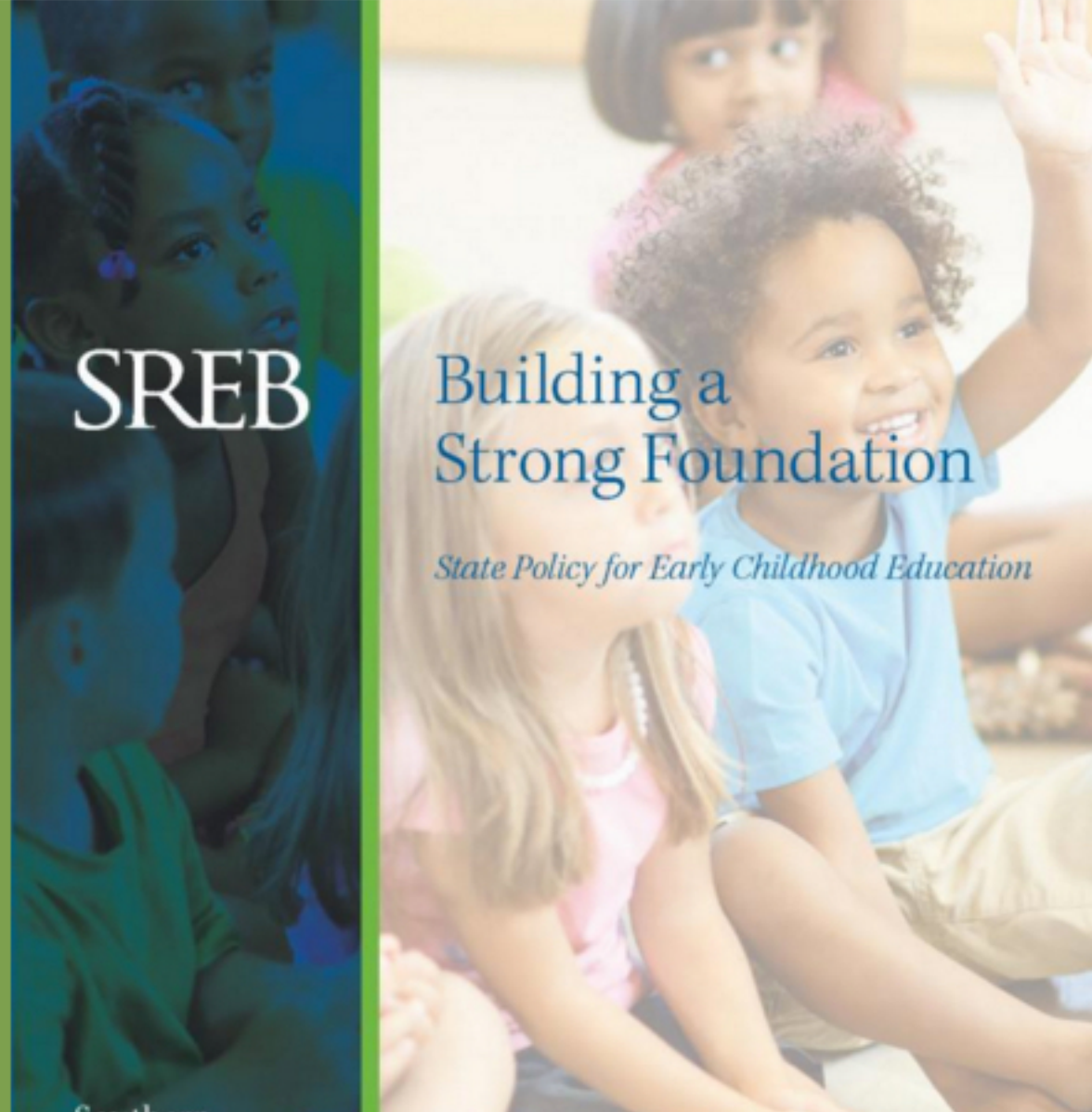

1. You can edit social links by clicking Reorder and editing them individually. You can change the destination redirect if necessary. To change the icon, submit a ticket.

2. All navigation terms can be edited/reordered through Commands > Manage nav terms. The Topics, Ed Level, and State pull from the hidden nav terms at the bottom of the Manage nav terms page.

3. Carousel posts can be edited/managed like regular posts. If adding new posts here, they must be the Hero post type and tagged to the hidden nav term Home: Hero. For posts to automatically carousel, more than one posts needs to be added.

4. Image and text can be edited like a normal post with title/subtitle. Currently, links are disabled and the Read more is hidden. If you need these to display again, submit a ticket. Any post can be tagged to this hidden nav term Home: Call to Action, but only one post will display at a time. To change which post displays, click reorder and put the desired post on top.

5. Section headers and descriptions for Stay Informed, Education Level, Spotlight, and Get Social are themed into the site. If you want to change the text, submit a ticket.

6. The order of the blocks and titles for SREB News, Critical Issues, and Events are themed into the site. To change these, submit a ticket. You can manage all posts within these three sections manually. Each section has a hidden nav term under Home: News/Critical Issues/Events. Nothing will automatically show up here, you will need to tag all posts to the appropriate hidden nav term.

7. All six of these are individual posts and can be managed like any other posts on the site. Edit the titles, subtitles, images, and destination redirects for each post individually. They can be any post type, but must be tagged to the Home: Education Level nav term to display.

8. The title and description for Member States is themed into the site. If you'd like to change any of the text, submit a ticket. The state dropdown is populated with the same nav menu that populates the above State menu. You can change these by going to Commands > Manage nav terms. If you need to change the interactive map graphic, you need to submit a ticket.

9. These are managed like normal posts. Any post can be tagged to Home: Spotlight to display here.

10. The order and icons are from the design and can only be changed by submitting a ticket. Each social link is an individual post and you can edit the destination redirect and the text in the box by overriding the "Read more" in the display settings of the post.

11. The SREB logo subtitle and contact information can be edited by editing the post. The list of member states is automatically populated by the same navigation menu that dictates the state in other parts of the homepage. To edit the states go to Commands > Manage nav terms.
