


### **Population, Economy, Schools and Government**

### SREB region represents increasing proportion of United States

Between 2006 and 2016, the population of the SREB region increased by 12 percent, adding 13.1 million new residents. The region is expected to grow by an additional 14.7 million people over the next 10 years. By current projections, SREB states will be home to 39 percent of the nation's population by 2026. Growth in the region continues to represent the largest proportion of growth in all 50 states and D.C. combined — more than 53 percent of the total growth in the nation from 2006 to 2016. While the SREB region's rate of population growth has slowed in recent years, it will continue to account for an increasing proportion of the United States population as a whole.


In 2016, the SREB region was home to 121.6 million people and four of the nation's 10 most populous states: Texas continues to be the second largest, with 27.9 million residents; Florida came in third with 20.6 million, Georgia was eighth with 10.3 million and North Carolina ninth with 10.2 million. In 2006, Florida, Georgia, Texas and North Carolina also were in the top 10.

While the SREB region saw its population grow by just over 12 percent from 2006 to 2016, the increase was 12 percent in the West, 3 percent in the Midwest and 3 percent in the Northeast. Growth in the United States slowed between 2006 and 2016 as compared with the period from 1996 to 2006, but it is projected to increase slightly over the next 10 years, from 8 percent to 9 percent.

### Progress in educational attainment continues in all regions

Since the year 2000, the percentage of adults ages 25 and older with high school diplomas or GED credentials has increased nearly 7 percentage points in the United States, and more than 8 percentage points in the SREB region. In 2000, 78 percent of adults in the SREB region had high school diplomas or GED credentials, compared with 80 percent in the nation. By 2015, the rate in the SREB region had increased to 86 percent, narrowing the gap with the national rate, at 87 percent. The West fell below the national average, to 86 percent, while both the Midwest and the Northeast exceeded the national average, at 90 percent and 89 percent respectively.

The percentage of adults ages 25 and older with a bachelor's degree or higher also improved between 2000 and 2015. In 2000, 22 percent of 25-and-older adults in SREB states and 24 percent in the nation held a bachelor's degree or higher. By 2015, 28 percent of adults in the SREB region held at least a bachelor's degree, compared with 31 percent in the nation. Rates in the West and Northeast were above the national average; the Midwest was slightly below the national average.

#### Working-age population continues as focus of improvement


Working-age adults, usually defined as individuals who are 25 through 64 years old, have been a common focus in recent years among education leaders when comparing higher education attainment levels — both internationally and domestically. One reason is that the United States no longer leads the world

in the education attainment of this population. In 2015, the United States tied with Korea for the rank of fourth in the world for the percentage of the population with an associate degree or higher — behind Canada, Japan and Israel.

In making these international comparisons, some analyses — including ones made by the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development — focus on younger working-age adults, ages 25 to 34, as well as older working-age adults. Comparisons of workers in this younger age group showed that the United States ranked 13th among developed nations, with 42 percent of these young adults having earned an associate degree or higher in 2010. This attainment rate increased to 47 percent in 2015, raising the nation's ranking to 10th. Korea, where 69 percent of 25- to 34-year-olds had earned at least an associate degree by 2015, continues to lead in rankings of OECD countries for younger working-age adults, followed by Japan and Canada.

The proportion of working-age adults in the United States who have a bachelor's degree or higher has also increased in recent years, rising from 30 percent in 2010 to 35 percent in 2015. However, other nations have also seen more 25- to 64-year-olds earn bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees, resulting in a drop in the United States' OECD ranking from second in 2007 to third in 2015, behind Switzerland and Belgium.

### Undereducated adults remain an important market for colleges

As higher education attainment becomes ever more important to economic competitiveness, the number of undereducated working-age adults ages 25 to 44 is a key target population for education services. In 2015, nearly 3.9 million (or 12 percent) of 25- to 44-year-olds in SREB states did not have high school diplomas or GED credentials. About 19.2 million (60 percent) had not earned associate degrees, and 22 million (69 percent) had not earned bachelor's degrees. A greater concentration of undereducated adults resided in the SREB region than in the Midwest and Northeast, although the West had a higher percentage of these working-age adults without high school diplomas or GED credentials.


### Growth among minority populations continues to outpace others

The nation's black and Hispanic populations grew much faster than the white population from 2005 to 2015. In the SREB region, the black population grew by 15 percent and the Hispanic population grew by 44 percent, while the white population grew by 3 percent. Consequently, the portion of the population that is white dropped during this ten-year period from 64 percent to 58 percent of the total SREB population. Black population representation remained about 19 percent, and the Hispanic population rose from 14 percent to 17 percent.

In total numbers, these changes amounted to 6.3 million more Hispanic residents in the region, 2.9 million more black residents and 2 million more white residents in SREB states. In 2015, the SREB region accounted for almost 37 percent of the nation's Hispanic population and 57 percent of its black population. The Western states were home to slightly more of the nation's Hispanic residents: 40 percent.

Attainment rates for white adults holding a bachelor's degree or higher in both SREB states and the nation continue to exceed that of black and Hispanic adults by a wide margin. In 2015, 32 percent of white adults ages 25 and older in the SREB states had a bachelor's degree or higher. About 20 percent of black and 16 percent of Hispanic adults held at least a bachelor's degree. While white adults in SREB states attain bachelor's degrees at a rate that is 2 percentage points lower than that of their peers nationwide, the rate for black adults is almost equal to the rate for their peers nationwide, and Hispanic adults in the region exceed the rate for their peers nationwide by 2 percentage points.

Substantial progress in attainment rates occurred for all three racial groups from 2000 to 2015. In the SREB region, the rate for white adults with at least a bachelor's degree rose by 8 percentage points, the rate for black adults went up 6 percentage points, and the rate for Hispanic adults rose 4 percentage points. Other regions saw similar rates of increase.

The clear reality that the fastest-growing racial and ethnic groups continue to have lower education attainment levels poses a considerable challenge for the nation and the SREB region. The hope for having a well-educated populace in the future depends on creating accelerated improvement in the attainment levels of black, Hispanic and other fast-growing portions of the population.

### Shift toward working-age adults supporting dependents continues

Children under age 5, students ages 5 through 24, and adults 65 and older represented 48 percent of the SREB region's population in 2015. These groups are often referred to as the dependent portion of the population. By 2020, the dependent portion of the population is expected to equal the working-age population — people between the ages of 25 and 64. Dependent representation is projected to reach 53 percent in the SREB region by 2030. It is at that time that working-age adults will no longer outnumber the dependent portion of the region's population.

### School enrollment in South and West will grow, but more in South

Enrollment in public schools, pre-K through grade 12, grew by 3 percent nationwide and 9 percent in the SREB region from fall 2004 to fall 2014. Enrollment increased nearly 4 percent in the West, but declined by 2 percent in the Midwest and by almost 4 percent in the Northeast. Projections for the period from 2014 to 2024 show future enrollment rising 5 percent in the SREB region and 8 percent in the West. Further decreases of 0.4 percent in the Midwest and 2 percent in the Northeast are predicted.


In the 2014-15 school year, seven of the nation's 10 states with the highest percentages of elementary and secondary students eligible for free or reduced-price lunches were in the SREB region. In that year, more than half (57 percent) of the SREB region's school children were eligible for the lunch program. Lower proportions were eligible in the other regions. The percentages of school children eligible for the lunch program increased in nearly every SREB state from 2004-05 to 2014-15; six states saw increases of more than 10 percentage points. The one state whose proportion of qualifying children decreased was Alabama — the percentage dropped by 0.5 percentage points over the ten-year period.

### High school graduation rates continue to improve

In the 2010-11 school year, the federal government began requiring states to use a new formula, the Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rate (ACGR), for calculating public high school graduation rates. Unlike previously used graduation-rate formulas, the ACGR is not an estimate of high school graduation rates. Instead, ACGR involves counting the number of first-time ninth-graders who enter a high school and including them in a cohort that is followed for four years. During the years until graduation, students who transfer into the school are added to the cohort while those who transfer out, emigrate to another country, or die are subtracted from the cohort.

Based on the now five years of available ACGR data, public high school graduation rates are improving. Nationwide, the ACGR increased from 79 percent in 2010-11 to 83 percent in 2014-15. All regions experienced increases in the ACGR during this time, with the SREB region's rate rising 8 percentage points, from 78 to 86 percent. With this improvement, the ACGR for SREB states now exceeds the national ACGR by more than 2 percentage points.

Although high school graduation rates are improving, the rates among racial and ethnic groups vary considerably. In SREB states in 2014-15, Asian/Pacific Islander students posted the highest graduation rate (at 91 percent), followed by white students (at 88 percent), American Indian/Alaskan native students (at 80 percent), black students (at 80 percent) and Hispanic students (at 79 percent).

Students with limited English proficiency or disabilities, or who come from low income families, were also lower, at 64 percent, 66 percent and 78 percent respectively. Although the graduation rates for these three groups of students continue to lag those of their peers, SREB states are making progress — the rates increased for all three groups between 2012-13 and 2014-15.

### SREB states' per capita income continues to lag behind national average

Compared with 2011 levels, annual per capita income in the SREB region has lost ground to the national average. Per capita income in the region went from 93 percent of the U.S. average in 2011 to 91 percent by 2016. Two SREB states — Maryland and Virginia — had per capita incomes higher than the national average in 2016. Maryland's per capita income were among the nation's 10 highest in 2016. However, its rank has slipped in recent years, moving from fifth to seventh between 2010 and 2016.

Examining income another way, median household income in the SREB region was equal to 97 percent of the national average in 2005, fell to 87 percent in 2010, and decreased even further to 84 percent in 2015. Median households in SREB states earned \$9,312 less in 2015 than median-income households in the nation. However, SREB states still experienced an increase of 10 percent in median annual income between 2010 and 2015. Households in the West and Midwest saw increases of 17 and 18 percent, respectively. Median household income in the Northeast also increased, but by 8 percent — a rate that was lower than the SREB region's rate.

### Poverty greater in SREB region, but numbers decreased for children

In 2015, the poverty level for a four-person U.S. family was defined as annual income at or below \$24,250. The poverty rate was 16 percent in the SREB region, compared with 14 percent nationwide.

Poverty rates were higher among families with children. On average, 24 percent of children under age 18 in SREB states lived in poverty in 2015, compared with 21 percent nationwide. That means 6.8 million children lived in poverty in the region, with 13 SREB states home to more than one in five children living in poverty. Eighteen percent of children lived in families with incomes below the poverty line in the West (3.2 million children) and Midwest (2.8 million). The Northeast had the lowest poverty rate for children under 18, at 16 percent (1.9 million). From 2010 to 2015, the number of children in poverty in the SREB region decreased by 312,000. All other regions also saw decreases.

### Higher employment across the nation

From 2011 to 2016, employment in the SREB region rose by 8 percent, or more than 3.9 million workers. Over the same period, it rose 11 percent in the West, 5 percent in the Midwest and 4 percent in the Northeast, while nationwide it increased more than 6 percent.

As the nation's economy improved, the unemployment rate dropped dramatically from 9 percent in 2011 to 5 percent in 2016. In the SREB region, the unemployment rate went down from 9 percent to 5 percent during this period. In the West, it was more than halved, from 10 percent to 5 percent. In the Midwest, it dropped from 8 percent to 5 percent, and in the Northeast it fell from 8 percent to 5 percent.

Employment in all major economic sectors in the SREB region increased between 2011 and 2016. Many sectors saw increases of more than 10 percent during the period. The leisure, hospitality and related services sector grew by 17 percent, and the financial, professional and business services sector grew by 15 percent. Jobs in mining, logging and construction increased by 13 percent, followed by education and health services, where employment expanded by 12 percent, and trade, transportation and utilities, which saw a gain of nearly 11 percent. The manufacturing, information and government job sectors were the slowest to grow, at rates of 6 percent, 2 percent and 1 percent, respectively. These rates of growth exceed those during the period between 2009 and 2014, however.
