


### **College Affordability**

#### College costs continue to rise, but not in the private two-year sector

Nationwide, the average annual costs for an in-state undergraduate to attend a public four-year college reached \$21,000 in 2019-20 — more than double the 1989-90 average. Since 2009-10, that amount increased by 17 percent. Over that period, average costs at public two-year colleges rose 21 percent to \$11,100 for the 2019-20 school year. At non-public four-year colleges, average costs increased by 21 percent to \$45,900 between 2009-10 and 2019-20. Costs at non-public two-year colleges averaged \$26,700, down 8 percent since 2009-10.


Students from families with low to middle incomes are often more affected by the rising costs of college than their counterparts. One way to compare costs and show these disparities is to compare annual income with annual college costs, even though many families save for college over several years and do not pay annual costs from a single year of income. Using annual income as a point of comparison is especially useful to show the relative impact of college costs on families at different income levels.

For students from U.S. households in the lowest fifth of incomes, one year's costs to attend a public four-year college in 2019-20 equaled 138 percent of the average annual household income — almost 8 percentage points higher than just 10 years earlier and almost double the proportion of income required in 1989-90. In short, paying for a year of college for one child in these households would require the household's entire income for almost a year and a half. College costs for households in the middle fifth of incomes equaled 31 percent of the average household income in 2019-20 — less than 1 percentage point higher than in 2009-10. In contrast, costs amounted to 8 percent of the average income for households in the top fifth of incomes, decreasing by 1 percentage point since 2009-10 and increasing by 2 percentage points since 1989-90.

#### The increase in tuition and fees affects the lowest-income families more than others

For median-income households, in-state undergraduate tuition and fees at public four-year colleges and universities as a percentage of household income remained the same for the SREB region (15) but decreased slightly nationwide (from 14 to 13) between 2018-19 and 2019-20. In 2019-20, tuition and fees accounted for as little as 10 percent of household income in Florida and Maryland and as much as 19 percent in Alabama and South Carolina. The percentages were at or above the national average of 13 percent in 10 SREB states — Alabama, Arkansas, Delaware, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia and West Virginia — as well as in two states in the West, six in the Midwest and seven in the Northeast.

State comparisons for the lowest-income families show in-state undergraduate tuition and fees at public four-year colleges and universities decreased to 42 percent of median annual income in the SREB region in 2019-20, compared with 44 percent in 2018-19. In 2019-20, college costs for these families required a portion of annual income that ranged from 27 percent in Florida to 58 percent in Alabama and South Carolina. The percentages were at or above the national average of 39 percent in 11 SREB states — Alabama, Arkansas, Delaware, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia and West Virginia.

In 2019-20, the median annual cost of tuition and required fees for in-state undergraduates at public four-year colleges and universities in the SREB region was \$8,600 — less than 1 percent higher than the year before when adjusted for inflation. The U.S. median annual cost also increased less than 1 percent over the period. In the West, the increase was 3 percent, while the median costs decreased in the Midwest and Northwest by 1 percent. The median cost of tuition and fees in the Northeast was the highest of any region, and that in the West the lowest, at \$11,000 and \$8,200, respectively.

The median costs for out-of-state students in the SREB region were \$19,500 — over 2 times as much as for in-state students. In the West, out-of-state students paid almost three times as much as in-state students. In the Midwest and Northeast, they paid about twice as much.


#### Pell Grant awards are covering a decreasing proportion of education expenses

The federal Pell Grant program is the nation's largest need-based grant aid program for college students. The neediest students could receive a maximum grant of \$6,195 in the 2019-20 school year. Students in SREB states received more than \$10.5 billion in Pell Grants in 2019-20 — an over 2 percent decrease since 2014-15. Overall Pell grant funding in the region decreased in large part because the number of students in SREB states receiving Pell grants during that five-year period dropped by 16 percent. Public colleges saw a decrease of 14 percent in the number of Pell Grant recipients. However, recipients received larger grants, on average, in the 2019-20 school year. The average grant amount per recipient at public colleges in SREB states was \$4,121 —16 percent more than five years earlier.

Pell Grants have lost buying power over the last 30 years. The maximum Pell Grant in 1989-90 covered 46 percent of the average annual costs of attending a public four-year college and 19 percent at private four-year colleges. In comparison, the maximum grant in 2019-20 covered just 29 percent of the average annual costs of attending public four-year colleges and 13 percent at private four-year colleges.

In addition to Pell Grants, students attending college in SREB states in 2018-19 received \$315.5 million through the federal College Work-Study Program and \$336.2 million through the Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant program. The average amount that students in SREB colleges received from each of these programs increased between 2013-14 and 2018-19, with the largest increase — 16 percent — occurring in the Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant program.

#### SREB states award more state scholarships and grants than other regions


State scholarships and grants in SREB states reached nearly \$6.4 billion in 2018-19, accounting for 45 percent of the nation's total. From 2013-14 to 2018-19, need-based aid to undergraduate students in the SREB region increased 39 percent, compared to the national increase of 21 percent. SREB states accounted for 29 percent of the nation's total state need-based financial aid for undergraduate students in 2018-19 and 88 percent of the total for state scholarships and grants not based on need.

### Students borrow more using subsidized, unsubsidized and parent loans

Nationwide, the total amount borrowed to finance postsecondary education in 2014-15 was 75 percent of the total received through other types of financial aid (e.g., grants, work-study and tax benefits). In 2019-20, the amount borrowed dropped to 66 percent of the other types of aid. Over the last 30 years, the total amount students and their parents borrowed peaked at \$115 billion in 2011-12 and has since decreased to \$102 billion in 2019-20. Despite the recent decrease in total loans, the amounts of financial aid both borrowed and received have grown substantially over this period. In 1989-90, students and their parents borrowed over \$10 billion and received almost \$15 billion in other financial aid. By 2019-20, borrowing was at almost \$102 billion and other forms of financial aid totaled \$154 billion.

Federal loan programs supplied over \$28 billion in loans to students in SREB states in 2019-20. The average amount received through Stafford subsidized loans was up almost 2 percent from 2014-15 and averaged \$3,700 per recipient. Average Stafford unsubsidized loan amounts increased nearly 5 percent during that same period and averaged over \$6,900 per recipient. Parent Loans for Undergraduate Students (PLUS) grew by almost 11 percent and averaged more than \$15,000 per recipient in the region.

The percentage of first-time, full-time, degree- or certificate-seeking freshmen in SREB states who took out loans in their first year of college decreased 2 percentage points during the five-year period between 2013-14 and 2018-19. In 2018-19, 47 percent of these freshmen at public four-year institutions in the SREB region and in the nation took out loans that averaged \$7,000. In SREB states, students' loans in 2018-19 were more than \$400 larger on average than those taken out in 2013-14.

Eighteen percent of first-time students at public two-year colleges in the SREB region took on debt in 2018-19, a rate less than half that of students at public four-year colleges. This percentage was 7 percentage points lower than in 2013-14. The average loan disbursed to these students was just over \$4,700, up \$41 for the period.

#### Nationwide, students are responsible for 61 percent of net price

Is a college education in the United States affordable? The answer depends on the cost of attendance (tuition and fees, room and board, books and supplies), the ability of students and their families to pay, and the amount of financial aid and scholarships available. In 2018-19, the average amount of grant and scholarship aid amounted to 39 percent of the total cost of attendance for full-time, degree- or certificate-seeking, beginning college students nationwide and 38 percent in the SREB region. That left a net price of 61 percent of the total cost nationwide and 62 percent in the SREB region, which must be covered using loans or cash. Loans help students and their families break the cost of college attendance into monthly payments and stretch it over multiple years, but they raise college costs in the long term by adding interest.

## What Students and Their Families Pay¹ Public Four-Year Colleges and Universities, 2018-19





Nationwide, the average one-year cost for full-time, first-time degree- or certificate-seeking undergraduates paying in-state or in-district tuition at a public four-year college or university in 2018-19 was \$23,600. Among U.S. regions, the cost of attendance for these students ranged from \$22,900 in SREB states to \$24,800 in the Northeast. Average scholarship and grant aid for these students ranged from \$8,200 in the Midwest to \$10,500 in the West. The resulting "net price" (what's left for students and their families to pay after state and federal scholarships and grants) ranged from \$13,400 in the West to \$15,800 in the Northeast. Among SREB states, the gap between the cost of attendance and public grant and scholarship aid was lowest in Florida and West Virginia (\$10,900) and highest in South Carolina (\$19,200). To meet this "net price," students and their families had to turn to private grant aid, take out loans, raise the amounts they contributed, or find ways to cut expenses.

In 2019, 55 percent of the undergraduates receiving bachelor's degrees at public four-year colleges in the United States graduated in debt for their college education, owing \$27,500 on average. In the SREB region, the percentage of these graduates was slightly smaller — 54 percent of graduates in the region had outstanding college loans, with an average debt of \$28,200. Since 2014, the percentage of college graduates in the nation who left school with student loan debt decreased by 5 points, and the average amount owed increased by 6 percent. In SREB states, this increase in debt was almost 8 percent. The West had the lowest percentage of graduates with loans and the lowest average debt, followed by the SREB region.

#### Changing demographics will make affordability a challenge

Demographic shifts are under way across the nation and in SREB states. With many states setting high goals for college completion and educational attainment, making and keeping college affordable will be increasingly important.

Non-white students will make up a larger portion of the college-bound group in the coming decades. They were 49 percent of the nation's public high school graduates in 2018-19 and are projected to increase to 57 percent by 2035-36, according to the Western Interstate Commission on Higher Education. Students in these groups more often come from middle- and lower-income families, which will have the most difficulty meeting rising costs.

The medians for the United States and each region are the middle values of all four-year colleges and universities. The median for each state is the middle value of the institutions in that state. Tuition and fees reported for the SREB states represent an annual course load of 30 credit-hours — the number to keep a student on track for on-time graduation. The non-SREB states report is based on an annual course load of 24 credit-hours — the minimum number required to qualify as a full-time student for federal student financial aid programs.

The cost of living (academic-year Consumer Price Index) increased by 1.8 percent from 2018-19 to 2019-20

Subsidized loans are awarded to undergraduate students based on financial need. These loans do not accrue interest while the student is in school at least half-time or during deferment period. Unsubsidized loans are for both undergraduate and graduate students that are not awarded based on financial need. Students are charged interest from the time the loans are disbursed until they are paid in full. Students can choose to allow the interest to accumulates and be capitalized — that is, the interest will be added to the principal amount of the loan and additional interest will be based on the higher amount. Direct Subsidized loans and Direct Unsubsidized Loans are also known as subsidized and unsubsidized Stafford Loans.
