Kentucky Teacher Wins Math Teaching Award

Role model honored for Mathematics Design Collaborative strategies

July 10, 2017 — Athraa Alabudy of Olmsted Academy South in Louisville, Kentucky, won the Outstanding MDC Teacher Award from the Southern Regional Education Board. The teacher in Kentucky's Jefferson County Public Schools was honored at SREB's College- and Career-Readiness Standards Networking Conference July 10 in Nashville, Tennessee.

The Outstanding MDC Teacher Award recognizes a teacher who has shifted her instruction using Mathematics Design Collaborative practices that engage students in understanding, reasoning and applying math content to complex problems.

Alabudy was honored for creating project-based assignments as culminating tasks, thereby helping students connect their learning to real-world activities. The results can be seen in her students' performance on district proficiencies and the statewide K-PREP test.
