The Annual Meeting of the SREB Council on Collegiate Education for Nursing will be held at the **JW Marriott Hotel Buckhead (3300 Lenox Road N.E)** in the heart of Atlanta's Buckhead community. The hotel is connected by an enclosed promenade to the shopping and dining areas of Lenox Square Mall.

A **MARTA** subway station (http://www.itsmarta.com) is across the street from the hotel and provides convenient access to and from Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport and many major attractions in Atlanta.
