Lehigh Career & Technical Institute Wins 2022 Pacesetter School Award

Institute honored for excellence in creating an aligned curriculum

July 19, 2022 — Lehigh Career & Technical Institute in Schnecksville, Pennsylvania, is the winner of a 2022 Gene Bottoms Pacesetter School Award from the Southern Regional Education Board. The school will be honored on July 19, 2022, at SREB's Making Schools Work Conference in Grapevine, Texas.

Pacesetter School Awards recognize schools that are implementing one of SREB's Making Schools Work school improvement frameworks and are achieving success in meeting bold goals related graduation rates, readiness for college and careers, and credential attainment.

Lehigh Career & Technical Institute implements <u>Technology Centers That Work</u>, SREB's school improvement design for technology centers. LCTI believes that student achievement is realized through a strong curriculum, sound instructional practices and connections with business and industry. The Institute has addressed these factors by evaluating its curriculum, offering professional development on instructional integration and adopting learning management systems that support quality instruction.

An internal audit reinforced the need to improve the internal process for reviewing and aligning its curriculum. LCTI used SREB's TCTW design to develop a revised curriculum framework that modernized its approach to competency-based education and increased opportunities to integrate career and technical education with academic content.

LCTI's curriculum and instruction teams streamlined curricula into one framework model for both academic and CTE courses. Teachers also aligned their curriculum with industry certifications, digital badges or micro-credentials, and postsecondary courses of study to increase opportunities for students to earn dual enrollment and articulated credits.

LCTI also transitioned to a new platform to manage curriculum, instructional materials, learning activities and assessments, course and standard alignment and task tracking. This created equitable access to materials for all teachers during the COVID-19 pandemic.

In the 2020-21 school year, LCTI students earned 1,022 industry certifications. Students also benefit from a new flexibly scheduled co-op capstone program that allowed students to work during the pandemic, gain work-based educational experiences or earn apprenticeship hours.

SREB's <u>Making Schools Work Conference</u> is held annually and provides educators with opportunities to participate in professional development, network with colleagues from across the country and build school and district leadership capacity.
