
Percentage working-age adults, by race and ethnicity, 2014


Percentage working-age adults, southern region, 2008-2014


Unemployment Rates and Median Weekly Earnings

So far, what do we know?

- Goal on postsecondary attainment rate involves workingage adults
- High-quality certificates add 3 5 percentage points to attainment
- About 43% of working-age adults have postsecondary credentials
- Little progress on the goal since 2008




K-12 Enrollment Growth


Public K-12 Enrollment

Children in **Poverty**


Percentage under 18 living in poverty, 2014

- Need to help more struggling families








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Eighth-Grade Reading


Percentage scoring at or above NAEP Proficient

12th-Grade Reading


Percentage scoring at or above NAEP Proficient




High School Graduation Rates

All students




SREB states where 100% of seniors took the ACT


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
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
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Share of young high school graduates **not enrolled** and not employed

By gender, 1990 to 2016





Postsecondary Enrollment – SREB States


Rate of recent HS graduates enrolling, Fall 2014

6-Year College Graduation Rates


Fall 2008 first-time, full-time freshmen at public 4-year colleges and universities (2014)


6-Year College Graduation Rates
