

South Stanly High Wins Outstanding School Award

North Carolina school honored for Literacy Design Collaborative, Mathematics Design Collaborative teaching strategies

July 10, 2017 — South Stanly High School in North Carolina's Stanly County School District won the Outstanding LDC-MDC School Award from the Southern Regional Education Board for its schoolwide implementation of the Literacy Design Collaborative and Mathematics Design Collaborative teaching strategies. The school was honored at SREB's College- and Career-Readiness Standards Networking Conference July 10 in Nashville, Tennessee.

Under the leadership of principal Tanya Crisco, all South Stanly High teachers now use either the LDC or MDC framework (except self-contained exceptional children's classes in occupational course of study). Principal Crisco is actively engaged in school visits and attends the majority of the observations and debriefings of her teacher-leaders.

SREB's College- and Career-Readiness Standards Networking Conference brings together educators to learn and improve classroom strategies with the Literacy Design Collaborative and the Mathematics Design Collaborative frameworks. LDC and MDC have re-energized thousands of teachers by creating a collaborative environment that builds teacher confidence and student learning. SREB helps schools adopt these strategies through planning, training and coaching. The 2017 conference, the fifth annual, is in Nashville, Tennessee, July 10-12.
