

Education Data



Helping states stay up to date on the latest interstate comparisons and trends in education is a core service of SREB. The Education Data program collects, analyzes and shares demographic, economic, pre-K-12 and higher education data among SREB states.

The program publishes the SREB Fact Book on Higher Education, one of the nation's most comprehensive collections of comparative data, and updates it online continually. The Fact Book includes data on the population and economy, enrollment, degrees, student tuition and financial aid, faculty and administrators, revenue and expenditures. Fact

Book Bulletins keep policy-makers informed on key issues. In all but the specialized cases of data based on SREB's regional survey (see below), figures for each of the 50 states are available online.

The backbone of the *Fact Book* is the **SREB-State Data Exchange**, which compiles the most up-to-date comparisons of higher education data in the region. It profiles where SREB state universities, colleges and technical institutes stand on enrollment, degrees conferred, student persistence and progression, full-time-equivalent enrollment and college classes taken by high school students, funding for colleges, funding for state student aid, student tuition/fees and faculty compensation with the year-to-year changes that leaders and the general public need to know. In addition, the Data Exchange's annual survey includes the nation's first and most detailed annual interstate profiles on e-learning.

Guide to users: The SREB-State Data Exchange files contain one to two years of data summarized by state and institutional category, including by-college detail. Long-term trends for all of the data elements from the SREB-State Data Exchange are contained in corresponding *SREB Fact Book on Higher Education* files. The Data Library combines both sets of files into one organized archive.




Annual Tuition and Fees* Public Four-Year, 2012-13

Annual Tuition and Fees* Public Two-Year, 2012-13




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
Weighted Average Salaries of Full-Time Faculty Public, Four-Year Colleges, 2012-13

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Weighted Average Salaries of Full-Time Faculty Public, Two-Year Colleges, 2012-13

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

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
Is progress toward educational attainment goals at risk?

Percent with Associate's Degree or Higher, 2005 to 2012

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
Educational Attainment by Race/Ethnicity, 2012



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

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Higher Education Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Fall 2012




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

Higher Education Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Fall 2007





Public, Four-Year Colleges and Universities, 2006 cohort





Public, Two-Year Colleges, 2009 cohort



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

Population 25 and Over, Median Annual Earnings


United States, 2012




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Projected Job Openings by Education Level

Relationship Between Educational Attainment and Per Capita Income, 2012



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

Public Four-Year Colleges, 2011-12





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
Funding for Postsecondary Education
